- Describe & apply how to test for TB infection, including preferential use of interferon gamma release assay (IGRA) testing for non-U.S.-born persons
- Describe & advise on/facilitate/perform proper clinical evaluation to distinguish LTBI from TB disease
- Describe & advise on/provide/apply preferred short-course LTBI treatment regimens to improve treatment completion outcomes
